CONFERENCE

Completing your Conference Registration Form - You must be a current member and login to the members only area to register for the conference. You need to complete the registration process online, if that is a problem for you please call 408 371-8239 for help. Go to the homepage at www.crpoa.org. All classes and the registration form are available on the members only site.

- 1. Many officers combine conference attendance with a family week-end. Hotel and conference space is limited. Hotel registration must be made directly with the hotel and not through ARPOC 2017 or CRPOA. We recommend that you complete your hotel registration at the same time you complete the conference registration.
2. The conference fee is payable by Visa, MasterCard or American Express. Payment must accompany registration unless special arrangements have been made in advance between your Department and the CRPOA Finance Office.
3. Registration for the full conference includes 3 continental breakfasts and 2 lunches.
4. On-site conference registration is permitted, but classes will be limited to space available; no on-site pre-registration for classes.
5. 24 hours of POST-certified classes will be offered at ARPOC 2018. It is recommended that you register early for classes you wish to attend. That way you will be best assured of a space in that class. Remaining seats will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. There will be an Opening Welcome Session at 2:00 PM including the latest on firearms and other legislation and court decisions, Q&A with POST reps and other important topics. Then our 4-hour, POST-certified headliner class "Boston Marathon Bombing" The investigation and successful prosecution. You won't want to miss this class!
6. All seminars and training classes will be held or originate at the hotel conference center. Transportation is provided for off-site classes starting an hour before class start time.
7. Review the Class Descriptions to select the classes you would like to attend and complete the Conference Registration Form you will get a confirmation notice by email. The last day to pre-register for ARPOC 2018 classes is Monday, August 9 2018.
8. If you decide to change classes at the conference you may do so if space is available. You need to sign the class roster at both the beginning and end of the full class to receive POST credit for your attendance.

HOTEL

Our host hotel is the DoubleTree by Hilton Sacramento, located at 2001 Point West Way, Sacramento. The DoubleTree is in the heart of the Sacramento Point West Marketplace, adjacent to Arden Fair Mall. The hotel is conveniently located off Business 80, 11 miles from the Sacramento International Airport and within minutes of the State Capitol, Old Sacramento, the California Railroad Museum, and Downtown Sacramento.

The hotel houses several dining and entertainment options, including Twigs Cafe featuring California cuisine, Twigs Lounges, In-room dining, espresso bar, and RJ's Happy Hour Club featuring pub food and adult beverages, pool tables and large screen TV's for sporting events. Recreation activities at the hotel include an outdoor pool, whirlpool spa, and a Hilton Fitness Center. For Evening Dining and entertainment there are several other restaurants located within minutes of the hotel, including: Elephant Bar, El Torito, The cheesecake Factory, Hooters, Olive Garden, In-N-Out Burger, and Applebee's.

Most classes, the vendor area, and all furnished meals will be held at the DoubleTree. For our group, the DoubleTree will be charging a room rate of \$135 per night, single or double occupancy. Applicable fees, state and local taxes, and assessments are extra. Guests are responsible for making their own reservations and paying for their own accommodations. All reservations must be guaranteed with a major credit card. Complimentary Internet Access is furnished in the guestrooms and public areas. Check-In time is 3:00 p.m. and check out time is 12:00 p.m.

PARKING

DoubleTree overnight guests will not be charged for parking including in and out privileges, when you arrive take the parking ticket to hotel registration for validation. ARPOC registered attendees who live locally, Instructors and Vendors should bring their parking ticket to the ARPOC Registration Desk in the Grand Ballroom for validation.

For individuals who elected to stay at other hotels or private homes you will be responsible for your own parking expense with no in-and-out parking privileges. Attendees and guests who choose to use valet parking are responsible for their own parking fees.

Q - How do I receive POST credit for the classes I attend?

A - Simply attend the class for the complete session **and** sign the roster at the beginning and end of each class. ARPOC staff will validate your attendance by arrival and departing signatures on the class roster. You, your agency and POST will each receive written notification of your satisfactory completion.

Q - Do I need to attend the entire class to receive POST credit?

A - POST Regulations require you be present for 90% of the class. Our instructors have designed the class material to fill the entire Class time. Aside from the scheduled breaks you are expected to be present at the class for the entire time the class is in session. There is no credit provided for partial attendance. Please keep in mind that the majority of instructors have donated their time to provide you with training they believe important for your safety and knowledge. Hopefully you will thank them with your courtesy by being on time for the class and by remaining for the entire session. You **Must Sign In and Sign Out of each** class for credit.

Q - Do I need to provide any special equipment or supplies for my class?

A - When you receive your Registration Confirmation indicating you have a reservation to attend the class you selected, you will also receive notification of any items you will need to provide. A tablet or laptop would be good if you are comfortable working with them (not required). If you need to bring your duty weapon and ammunition and are planning to fly to the conference, please check with your airline to determine its regulations. Please call the CRPOA Office, toll free, at 855-552-7762 ext. 2 if you have any questions.

Q - What should I do with my weapon when I am not using it for training?

A – Exposed firearms are **prohibited for non-uniformed persons** except when traveling directly to or from a firearms training facility. We suggest that you bring a lockable storage container, so your weapon is not readily accessible when it is not in your possession.

Q - The registration process indicates I should receive a confirmation within 2 weeks from the time I mailed or faxed all the Registration Forms and provided my payment. It has been over 2 weeks, what should I do?

A - Please call the ARPOC Registration Office, toll free, at 855-552-7762 ext. 2, and leave a detailed message with your contact information. We will check on your confirmation and contact you.

Q - I am completely registered for the conference but I cannot attend. What should I do?

A - The refund guidelines are outlined in Step 1 of the Registration Process. You may also seek someone to replace you at the conference. Attendee substitutions will be permitted with written authorization of the payer at no additional expense. Please call the CRPOA Office, toll free, at 855-552-7762 ext.2 if you wish to make a substitution or have any questions.

Q - I am registered for a class but have decided I would like to attend a different class. What should I do?

A - Registration simply secures you a reservation for the class. If you make the decision to substitute a class prior to the early bird deadline for registration (July 20th), please send an email to janet@crpoa.org with the details of your requested change. You will be notified as to whether the change can be completed. If you decide after the deadline, you should check-in at Conference Registration to determine whether space is available. If space is available, you may simply go to the new class. Make sure you sign the roster at the **start and end** of the class. If the class you wish to attend is offsite, bring your required equipment with you and go to the bus circle 30 to 45 minutes prior to start of the class. If there is space available you will be allowed on the bus by the conference host on a first-come, first-selected basis.

Q - Can I purchase additional tickets for the Awards Luncheon on Friday?

A - Check at the CRPOA Vendor Table. If tickets are available, they may be purchased prior to Friday. The cost per ticket is approximately \$40 and there will be no refunds.

Q - Is there a special dress code for the conference?

A - Leisure clothing is suggested for most of the conference. Some classes may require special dress and equipment. Please check for these requirements on your Registration Confirmation. No exposed weapons, **Please**, unless you are in full uniform.



ARPOC 2018 Welcome! An opening address by CRPOA & POST with a short Q&A. Followed by our **Opening Class**, On April 15, 2013, two pressure cooker bombs exploded in the vicinity Boston Marathon finish line. Three people died, including an eight-year-old boy, and over 260 people were injured. Eighteen people suffered amputations as a result of the blasts. The perpetrators then went on to murder a police officer before being captured by law enforcement officials. Special Agent David Bell will provide a detailed timeline of events, beginning with the response to the bombings and concluding with the successful prosecution of the surviving terrorist. SA Bell will speak about the challenges associated with conducting complex terrorism investigations, the importance of inter-agency cooperation, and the lessons learned during the **Boston Marathon Bombing investigation and successful prosecution.**

Middle Eastern Culture and Law Enforcement This 4-hour class on Middle Eastern Culture and Law Enforcement is for law enforcement to understand the difference between Chaldean Christians and Arab Muslims. It focuses on the history and culture of each of the communities, in addition to their community structures. This class can be beneficial for law enforcement when it comes to interacting with members of the community. Additionally, it offers insight on how understanding Middle Eastern cultures and dynamics can assist in de-escalating potential situations.

Narco Officer Safety: Avoiding the Chemical Bullet - One of the most dangerous aspects of narcotic enforcement is dealing with unknowns. Over the last decade the proliferation of synthetic drugs, manufacturing and distribution has created extreme hazards for officers. If you cannot “recognize a hazard, you can’t protect yourself” This training class is designed for all public safety professionals who contact subjects, enter residences (i.e. search warrants, probation checks) and conduct investigations. This course will also address specific hazards associated with manufacturing-controlled substances (i.e fentanyl, counterfeit tablets). The course primarily addresses officer safety and hazard assessment. Do not allow yourself to be taken out by a “Chemical Bullet” - Topics Include: **Officer Safety – Mexico - Smuggling Trends - Fentanyl Laced Heroin/Carfentanil - Synthetic manufacturing /Counterfeit Tablets**

Drones and your Agency - Getting Your Drone Program off the Ground (Pun Intended). Criminals are now using swarms of small drones to befuddle law enforcement. Don’t get caught behind the technology learning curve. This informative course will detail the proper use of sUAS in law enforcement. The topics that will be covered are: - Introduction to sUAS - FAA Regulations - Community Considerations

* **Policy and Procedures** * **Enforcement** * **Threats and Counter UAS (cUAS)** * **How to start a Program**

Law Enforcement agencies, which are considering deploying, testing drones, or currently deploying drones, are encouraged to attend.

Low Light No Light CQ8 Hostage Rescue/Officer Extrication – A new world merges when the sun set, Criminals use the cloak of darkness to their advantage as statistics show some of the most heinous crimes such as gun-violence and sexual assaults exponentially increase at night. According to B.J.S. in some major cities as much as 80% of officer involved shootings happen in low light situations. In this 8-hour course you will learn from seasoned Navy seals on Low Light/No Light close Quarters combat. They will lecture upon real world experience from operations in some of the world’s most hostile environments. From hostage rescue to covert infiltration, students will learn methods employed in low-visibility situations to practical applications in a simulated environment.

Reserve Coordinators Introduction This 8-hr. class is designed to provide an overview of the reserve program to coordinators who are newly assigned or have limited experience in their positions. The subjects covered will include POST Regulations, reserve levels, reserve officer selection, entry level and in-service training requirements and reserve program management. As an introductory class it is preliminary in nature and is not intended to take the place of the POST-certified 24-hour Reserve Coordinator Class.

Active Shooter Building Search - This 4-hour course will familiarize the student with the core concepts and principles of building searches, focusing on the maintaining the tactical advantage with minimum exposure while maneuvering. Emphasis on "reading" and recognizing terrain features, situational awareness, simplification of procedures, individual and team movement, communication between team members and the de-mystification of tactics.

Vehicle Tactics This 4-hour course will review the tactics employed while operating in and about your patrol vehicle. The focus will be on realistic deployment including use of cover, individual and team movement, threat recognition and mitigation, team resource management and communications skills, realistic ambush response, and high-risk vehicle stops. The training will include development drills to enhance those skills and scenarios to put the skills into play.

Marijuana Update A look at Recreational and Medical Cannabis and the changing Laws This class will provide an update on issues pertaining to marijuana and Proposition 215 and Senate Bill 420. Recent court decisions highly recommend that officers have specific training in these laws to qualify as an expert when arresting person(s) in possession of marijuana and are claiming the protections under Proposition 215. Training in this area is also highly recommended for successful arrest and prosecution of medical marijuana cases. The course will also provide information on the latest trends in marijuana use and cultivation, contacting and questioning those who claim, "Prop 215 privileges", the Butane Honey Oil THC extraction process and the marijuana store front activities.

Reserve Coordinators Update. The Update Class is intended to provide experienced coordinators with a review of changes in law and regulation affecting the reserve program, pending legislation. Course certification and compliance reviews. It will be interactive using breakout groups to address contemporary issues and problems and an open forum to review best practices. The instructors will be members of POST staff. Due to the format of the Update Class, prior completion of the 24-hour class or an update class is preferred, but not required.

FLSA and Reserves "This course is designed to introduce the student to the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) and how it applies to Reserve Peace Officers as well as other agency members. Discussion will include what some of the laws are, common issues that arise, and how to assist you and your agency in avoiding potential violations. We will be reviewing portions of the Code of Federal Regulations, 29 CFR 553, and how they impact you and your agency"

Major Crime Scene Investigations for First Responder This course will discuss major crime scenes (Homicides, Rapes, Robbery and Suspicious Deaths) and what first responders need to consider. These considerations include the search for additional victims, suspects, loss of evidence due to weather or other exigent circumstances the victim's family and the media. The L.I.N. (Locate, Isolate and Neutralize) theory of crime scene investigations and other theories related to crime scenes will be discussed. Graphic photographs will be presented during this course of instruction.

Below 100 This course is intended to provide officers with an overview of the national Below 100 campaigns and provide details on the five tenets with the goal of providing practical information and safety reminders in a powerful way that will improve officer safety and reduce the number of deaths and injuries in the law enforcement community. Powerful videos are used to make an emotional connection with the audience and help make material more impactful. The course will cover issues not necessarily addressed in manuals or policy. This will include an overview of trends and examples of officers killed in the line of duty with particular emphasis on practical steps to avoid these circumstances.

Outlaw Motorcycle Gangs A 4-hour course on understanding and recognizing outlaw motorcycle gang members and their related criminal activities, including narcotics trafficking, turf wars, vehicle theft, officer safety issues and more. This class is restricted to currently sworn peace officers or with the permission of the CRPOA Training Manager.

Off Duty - The Beginning of Your Real Day We will explore what to do when your shift ends, and real life begins. We will look at everything from ethics to officer safety. Let's open up to see the pitfalls many get trapped in. Learn to recognize and avoid them. You will better survive "Off Duty."
